Special operating conditions or restrictions:

- 1 The permittee/licensee shall, upon completion of construction and during the equipment test period, make proper radiofrequency electromagnetic (RF) field strength measurements throughout the area, including inside and on the roof of all nearby buildings, to determine if there are any areas that exceed the FCC guidelines for human exposure to RF fields. Any areas, including inside or on the roof of a building, found to exceed the recommended guidelines must be clearly marked with appropriate visual warning signs which describe the nature of the hazard. Furthermore, access to these areas must be restricted to prevent the exposure of humans to RF fields in excess of the FCC Guidelines (OET Bulletin No. 65, Edition 97-01, August 1997). Documentation demonstrating compliance with this special operating condition shall be submitted at the time of filing of the FCC Form 350-FM.

Special operating conditions or restrictions:

- 2 The permittee/licensee in coordination with other users of the site must reduce power or cease operation as necessary to protect persons having access to the site, tower or antenna from radiofrequency electromagnetic fields in excess of FCC guidelines.

- 3 Prior to commencing program test operations, FM Translator or FM Booster permittee must have on file at the Commission, FCC Form 350, Application for an FM Translator or FM Booster Station License, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Section 74.14.
